Limerick Riverfest Under Way

Limerick Riverfest gets under way from Friday 28th–Monday- 1st April this bank holiday weekend. The event is jam packed with events for everyone , but for those of you who will read this bulletin on Sunday you will be right in the thick of it with the Barringtons great run finishing outside this church.

Limerick's biggest festival will embrace the scenic River Shannon, with spectacular performances by world champion Jetboarders and Jet Ski as well as key waterfront displays at Arthur's Quay from 2 pm.

Limerick's Horse-drawn Carriage tours will run throughout the day with Hermitage Green 'live' at Kings John's Castle Sunday evening at 7pm followed by spectacular fireworks display at 10.15pm.



Monday events get under way at the Festival Village in Arthur's Quay from 12.30 –3.00pm with Get West Kayaking and Paddle Boarding at Limerick Boat Club from 10.00am. There will be Cycle and Carriage tours throughout the day certainly a treat for all the family. With artisan food, crafts, retail stalls and stunning vintage amusements set against the backdrop of the glistening River Shannon.

The Ballyhoura International walking festival will begin on Friday running all the way through till Monday with the Kilfinane Town Walk on Monday registration at town centre at 11.00am. A historical walk of Bruff at 2.00pm from the church of Ireland Bruff, and the Caherconlish town walk at 2.00pm. Definitely something for all the family! Pick up your programme at the back of the church.

Death of Fr. John O'Sullivan O.S.A.

The death occurred last Tuesday of Fr. John O'Sullivan O.S.A. in Ballyboden Co. Dublin. There may be a few like myself who remember Fr. John who served here in St. Augustine's in 2002. Born in Ring Co. Waterford in 1926 and referred to, by his brethren as 'Long John' the term that never bothered him. He made his profession in September 1945, and his solemn profession in 1948.

He spent many happy years with the Augustinians in Hammersmith, London. The next five years were spent in Galway until 1959 when he was appointed to the important office of Master of Professed, at Ballyboden Dublin. In 1973 for health reason Fr. John went to Australia and remained there doing great work until 1992.

He had a lovely way with people, and his gentle approach and happy smile put him into a very special class of person. May he rest in peace.
