On Thursday 8th September we begin our Taizé Prayer Service in the side chapel at 5.00pm. Through candlelight and silence this prayer service allows for time to reflect, rest and restore through spending time listening to Bible readings, Prayer of intercession, and chants. At the centre of the Prayer Service is a **time of Contemplative Silence which offers the opportunity to meet God.**

The Taizé community focus on a single verse or even a line and by repeating this many times, it becomes a meditative and calming way of prayer. The melodies are both simple and repetitive and allow for community chanting.


In as much as we can, we endeavour to follow the format of the Taizé Community Prayer Service. What to expect when you attend is outlined below.

- Once all are seated the Prayer Service starts by listening in a gentle silence to a Taizé chant being played.
- All then listen to or join in singing three Taizé chants. The words are provided on a sheet.
- A Psalm is read and we spend a minute reflecting on this before the Reading is read by a member of the congregation.
- This is then followed by a Taizé chant.
- Next, central to the Taizé Prayer is **A Time of Silence** (between 8 to 20 minutes)
- The prayers of intercession are read, preceded by a chant which is sung a number of times.
- The Our Father is recited together.
- All join in for our Concluding Prayer
- We then listen to or sing two Taizé chants.
- These are played quietly and you are welcome to stay within the silence and peace.

If you wish to leave, we respectfully ask that you leave the chapel quietly to allow those who wish to remain for a longer period in contemplative silence.

If your looking for an **'oasis of peace'** why not join us for Taizé prayer on Thursday 8th Sept between 5pm-6pm. All religious affiliations welcome. Those who do not belong to any religious tradition, are equally welcome.

Invite your friends to come or just drop in to wind down after a busy day at work.

The Bible Exposed


Uncover the hidden treasures of the Bible!
