## *Limerick Sings in St. Augustine's*

Limerick is set to resonate with the sound of music across three days this June as choirs from all over the world and Ireland come together for the **Limerick Sings International Choral Festival 2016**.

Now in its fifth year, the festival, presented by Campus Life Services and University Concert Hall, was established to attract visiting choirs of all traditions and nationalities to Limerick for a weekend of festive, non-competitive singing in some of the city's wonderful venues, providing exceptional choral entertainment to local audiences.

As part of the festival, two wonderful choirs – Cór Cois Abhann and Granbury High School Choir - will perform in **St. Augustine's Church on Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> June at 11.30am**.

**Cór Cois Abhann** (Choir by the River) was founded in 1990 as a mixed voice choir. Based in Cork City, with approximately 50 members they perform in concerts, choral festivals and charity events throughout the year under the musical direction of Ian Sexton.

**The Granbury High School USA** Mixed Choir has been named Outstanding Choir at Buccaneer Day, The Yellow Rose Classic, and American Music Festivals in Orlando, Florida and Nashville, Tennessee.



Limerick Sings Festival weekend will host three concerts in stunning venues around Limerick City and County. The **Opening Concert** will be held on **Friday 10th June** (8pm) in the beautiful surrounds of St. Mary's Cathedral. On Saturday evening at (8pm) the **Gala Concert** takes place in University Concert Hall. **Sunday 12th June** at 3.30pm will see the Festival coming to a rousing conclusion with an afternoon **Sunday Proms** in the **Holy Trinity Abbey Church** in Adare. The Proms will feature a delightful programme of folk, traditional and gospel songs as well as contemporary favourites by Billy Joel and Abba. 
## A Summer Prayer
