## Lenten Invitation of Jesus

**“Behold I stand at the door and knock, if anyone hears my voice and opens the door I will come in and eat with them and they with me.”**

Revelation 3:19-21

The Lord knocks at the door of our heart: do we hear Him?; do we feel a nudge of conscience to listen, to change, to be quiet for a moment, to make a decision? God will not force Himself into our lives, but knocks, ever so gently, and leaves it to us to open the door to His presence.

The painter Holman Hunt, 150 years ago, painted perhaps his best known work, *The Light of the World*. It represents Jesus, dressed as a king and holding a lantern, preparing to knock on an overgrown and long-unopened door, symbol of the human conscience. The door has no handle – it can only be opened from the inside. The large copy of the painting toured the world and is now in St. Paul's Cathedral, London (the original painting now hangs in Keble College, Oxford.)

We are all free to accept the Lord into our lives and open the door to Him. He seeks a full response: love, faith, service and endurance. In the Book of Revelations we read about the mighty city of Ephesus in Asia Minor, Turkey, and Jesus is saying to the city **“You have lost the love you had at first” (Rev.2,4). Without Love for Jesus of Nazareth, of the Gospels, we and the church are empty shells. Jesus tells the people of Ephesus that unless they return to love for him he will remove the lamp stand, His Light. Today Ephesus is an empty shell.**

This time of grace, Lent, is a time to listen to the knock and open the door, to receive the Light. It is a time for quiet, for prayer, daily. In your own home sit quietly, light a candle before an icon of the Lord, read a little of the Gospels, ponder the meaning. Best do this with one or two others – listen to one another. Invite the Lord to enter into your hearts. He will.
