Celebration of Ageing

In 1990 the United Nations initiated a "An International Day for Older Persons" to be held annually on October 1st. We decided to offer

a special liturgy to celebrate ageing and honour the elderly among us and our families.

Thank you for your presence and participation in helping us to celebrate. Below are some of the special features of this Mass of Thanksgiving so that you can follow in print as well as listening.

Display: Growing old – a blessing and a burden? On the sanctuary is a display showing some of the things we associate with increasing physical age:

- 1. A walking stick, a magnifying glass, hearing aids and medication from the chemist. But there is a positive side to ageing, too:
- 2. A book represents the wisdom learned over the years
- 3. Keys represent the experience gained in life's different situations and locations.
- 4. Many older people lead active lives gardening or joining clubs that offer opportunities for walking, art and crafts, golf etc.

Prayers of the Faithful

- 1. We turn our thoughts to those elderly people far away, left behind by refugees. These older family members may well have paid for the long, dangerous journeys, wanting a better life for their young people but knowing they may never see them again. Give them hope. (Pause) Lord, hear us.
- 2. We pray for the elderly in our society who are bed-bound or house-bound, imprisoned by their incapacity and ill-health, at home, in hospital or in residential homes. Give them the grace to accept their situation and make us generous in offering what help we can. (Pause) Lord, hear us.
- 3. We pray for the elderly people among our homeless, some of their lives shortened by alcohol or drug abuse and rough conditions on the streets. Stir our conscience, Lord, to do what we can to assist them. (Pause) Lord, hear us.
- 4. We offer thanksgiving for our own elderly relatives and friends, who, in their turn, inspired us, encouraged and supported us throughout our lives the good times and the challenges. Show us how to repay their goodness. (Pause) Lord, hear us

Concluding Prayer:

May the Lord support us all the day long, till the shadows lengthen and evening comes, the busy world is hushed, the fever of life is over and our work is done.

Then, in his mercy, may he grant us a safe lodging,
a quiet rest and peace at the last. Amen.

Destination Hope- A Journey For Life

The Northstar Family Support Project is a community based project providing non-judgemental, confidential support to families who are affected by, and trying to cope with, a family member's substance misuse.

They do this work by providing one on one support, access to counselling, training opportunities and vitally, through peer support and simply providing time and space for families to speak freely without judgement.

Their Annual Service of Commemoration and Hope will take place in this church next Thursday October 20th at 7.00pm. The service is an opportunity to remember loved ones who were lost through drugs

and alcohol misuse and to offer support to families left behind. The theme of the service this year is Destination Hope—A Journey For Life. Before the Service people will be invited to write a message of remembrance which will then be placed on a large candle at the altar. Every year a lot of work and preparation goes into this service and we would like to commend all those who work so tirelessly to make this such a wonderful success! Everyone is welcome.

Fr. Vivian Boland OF to give Lecture on St. Thomas Aquinas

On Thursday 20th October next, one of the world's leading experts on Thomas Aquinas' educational thought, Fr Vivian Boland OP, will deliver a free public

lecture at Mary Immaculate College (MIC) in Limerick at 7.30pm. In his talk, Fr. Boland will examine the pedagogy and philosophy of education of Aquinas.

Hosted by the Department of Theology and Religious Studies, MIC, the lecture will explore some themes in Aquinas' account of learning and teaching, with Fr Boland arguing that Aquinas' insights and concerns are of relevance today and can strengthen our understanding of the teacher's work and the learner's experience.
