Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, has appointed His Excellency Archbishop Jude Thaddeus Okolo, Titular Archbishop of Novica, as the Apostolic Nuncio to Ireland. It is expected that the date of Archbishop Okolo's arrival to Ireland will occur during the summer.

His Excellency Archbishop Jude Thaddeus Okolo was born in Kano, Nigeria, on the 18 December 1956. He was ordained to the priesthood on 2 July 1983 for the Diocese of Nnewi. Called to the Diplomatic Service of the Holy See, he began his first assignment in June 1990, in Sri Lanka. He served in many Pontifical Representations and in 2008 he was appointed Apostolic Nuncio to the Central African Republic of Chad.

Subsequently in 2013, he was appointed Apostolic Nuncio to the Dominican Republic and Apostolic Delegate in Puerto Rico. Archbishop



Okolo speaks many languages and enjoys sacred music, piano and reading.

Congratulating Archbishop Okolo on his appointment, Archbishop Martin said: "I warmly welcome the appointment by His Holiness Pope Francis and I wish him many blessings in his new role. I pray that his time among us as the representative of the Holy Father will be blessed and fruitful".

New Crematorium in Shannon

Co Clare's first crematorium is on the verge of completion at Illaunmanagh in Shannon. An open day will be held at the new facility, which is adjacent to Illaunmanagh Cemetery, on May 28th with the public welcome to view the development from 1-5pm.

At the moment, one in six people in Ireland are cremated, with the figure having risen very significantly in the last 10 years. In recent years, more people from the midwest have opted for cremation



for their loved ones but have had to travel to Dublin or Cork. The Catholic Church has approved cremation since 1963,

however we do insist that the ashes must be buried in a holy place. When cremation is chosen, it will as a general rule take place after the funeral Mass.

The cremated remains are shown the same respect as the body of a Christian; the vessel they are contained in, as well as how this vessel is treated, demonstrates respect and reverence for the sacredness of this person whom we now commend to the care of God. (Diocesan newsletter)

Youth Ministry Team

Following up on the Core Strategic Actions named at the Diocesan Synod last year and outlined in our Diocesan Pastoral Plan the Youth Ministry Team in the Diocese will be delivering a Youth Ministry Training Programme beginning in September 2017.

The ultimate aim of the programme will be to train people from Parishes/Pastoral Areas to deliver youth ministry in their own localities. Our goal is to empower and encourage people at local level to take on leadership roles in the area of youth ministry and so the training will be very much focused on the practical elements and will offer resources and tips as well as the looking at the theory and theology. Having spent over 10 years in youth ministry we know the importance of team work and support and so we are insisting that parishes would gather teams of 4 people to participate.



Details of cost, venues, dates etc are yet to be confirmed but at the moment we are looking at a 12 week course running one night a week from September to December and including one or two Saturdays. We are currently liaising with the Institute for Pastoral Studies, Mary Immaculate College and the Redemptorists who have run youth ministry training for the last 20 years.
