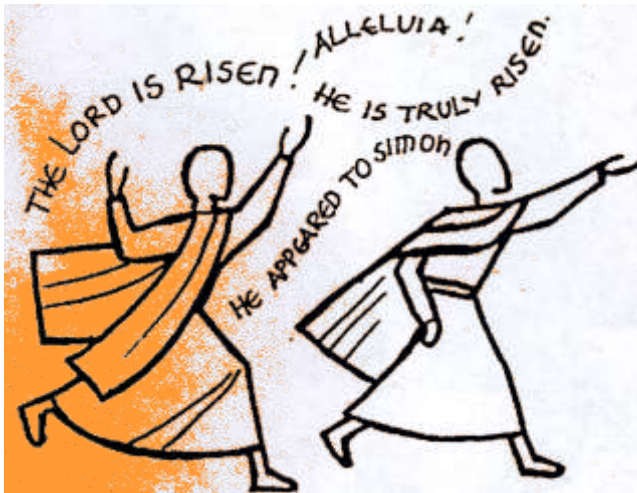

Surprise:

We can feel the energy in our very bones. We are to be different, having a different outlook on life, on relationships, on our daily cares.
