## The Advent Wreath Explained



This is a very brief explanation of the circle and of each of the candles, for those of you who made the enquiry.

The circle of evergreen represents eternity - life with God.

**1st candle** (purple) represents the Prophets - and their message was one of Hope.

**2nd candle** (purple) represents Bethlehem - and what took place there was Love.

**3rd candle** (pink) represents the Shepherds - who rejoiced (Gaudete Sunday), filled with Joy.

**4th candle** (purple) represents the Angels - their message was one of Peace to all those of good will.

White candle in the middle of the circle represents Light - the Light and Life of Christ.
