God Rich in Mercy


In his 2016 Lenten message Pope Francis has asked that “the season of Lent in this Jubilee Year be lived more intensely as a privileged moment to celebrate and experience **God’s mercy**”. By calling for an attentive listening to the word of God and encouraging the initiative “**24 Hours for the Lord**”, I sought to stress the primacy of prayerful listening to God’s word, especially his prophetic word. The mercy of God is a proclamation made to the world, a proclamation which each Christian is called to experience at first hand. For this reason, during the season of Lent I will send out Missionaries of Mercy as a concrete sign to everyone of God’s closeness and forgiveness. “Never forget this: The Lord never gets tired of forgiving us. It is we who get tired of asking for forgiveness”.



24 Hours for the Lord

In this context Bishop Brendan Leahy has invited the Augustinians to participate again this year with the diocese in this initiative. Beginning in the Augustinian Church **Friday 4th March after the 4.00pm Mass '24 hours Adoration for the Lord' will commence. It will end on Saturday 5th March with the anointing of the Sick at the 3.00pm Mass.** Priests from the Diocese, religious communities, and parishes will be invited to get involved and commit to giving some-time for adoration. There will also be priests available throughout the 24hrs for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. You are also invited to give, if you can some time to this Diocesan initiative and there is a rota page available at the back of the church which you can sign if you would like to commit some time to this '24 hours Adoration for the Lord'. This is a wonderful opportunity for us to experience the merciful love of God.
