How it makes the children they work for feel very **special and brightens up a very dark world for them'. This is just one story** of where the Limerick shoebox gifts went last year.

Coming back to school'.....

Mayankho is a vulnerable child aged 9 years in Phalombe district which is a very poor region in Ma**lawi. His family's daily income is** less 50 us cents. He comes from a family of 7 children which has increased their poverty level whereby children dropped school, have no access to medical services and struggle daily for food. Mayankho dropped out of school



and he spent most of his time begging for food on the streets. He also dropped out of school due to lack of clothes and school learning materials.

Mayankho has a real heart for school so that one day he should fulfil his

dream of becoming the medical doctor. The Christmas Shoebox gift he received has opened the way to come back to school as the Shoebox had all the answers which he has been lacking. He was so happy to see everything that was inside.

Thanks again for all you do to help us get even more Christmas Shoeboxes for children like Mayankho.

New Bishop for Killaloe Diocese



Fr. Fintan Monahan of the Tuam Archdiocese was appointed Bishop of Killaloe at his ordination ceremony in Ennis Cathedral last Sunday . In his address after his consecration, he described the year of **Mercy as a "busy and wonderful year in the Church".** The new bishop noted that Mother Teresa of Calcutta **had also been recently canonised. She is "a saint for our** day who speaks of the dark struggle the challenge and **huge effort that is part of each and every Christian's faith journey".**

He says that as part of the preparation for the great gathering of families in 2018, Pope Francis has given the **faithful** *'The Joy of Love'*, to nourish them in spirit.

Bishop Fintan Monahan was born in Tullamore in 1967 to parents Tom and Peg Monahan and has one brother and one sister. He was ordained a priest in 1991 and has been diocesan secretary of the Tuam archdiocese for the past 10 years.

On the objectives ahead, he indicated that his priorities would be the promotion of vocations, care of the clergy, and faith renewal in the diocese. His emphasis would be on continuing and expanding the greater involvement of laity, youth ministry and religious education. Among his other main priorities would be protection of life, family ministry, Eucharistic Adoration, liturgy and safeguarding children in the church. He also wishes to explore new ways to communicate the joy of the Gospel to his people.

We warmly welcome Bishop Fintan and pray that God will continue to bless him in his future ministry.
