If only we understood just a little how merciful and tender God is, our life would be changed, and fear would eliminate itself from our lives, the fear that eats us up like a sort of a cancer. Only yesterday someone said to me, "I am so depressed, so afraid." What can you say to people who are so afraid? True, there are all kinds of antidepressants and chemicals that may be taken, but they don't chase the fears away. We have so many fears. Healing comes from love; and fears can be dissolved by love.

It is good to have the 'gift of healing', but the family can heal, the parish can heal, the community can heal. Father, mother, children can heal each other. Healing comes from love; and fear, that type of fear, can be dissolved by love. And the community, family, parish, a religious community, each has the power of healing one another, provided they love one another.

But if I put between me and you a curtain of any kind, then I can't heal, because I can't love. You don't love when you separate people from one another, and so the tenderness and healing love of God cannot pass through your heart and reveal itself through you to someone else. If I put up a guard against anyone in my soul, then how in heaven's name can the tenderness, the mercy, the forgiveness and even the joy of the Lord go through me to someone else? And how can it touch me also, whilst I am giving it to someone else? This is so vastly important.

We can't love humanity as a whole. It's very easy for me to sit here and 'love' people in other countries or cities; I don't know them. But it is quite another story to love a person right in front of you. Really love; I don't mean just say, "I love you. I love you. I love you." No. Show it! Show it as God shows it—in mercy, in tenderness, in trusting one another.

The mercy, the compassion, the gentleness, the forgiveness of Christ—these are all around about us. So isn't it natural, as well as supernatural, that we turn around and act likewise with our brother and sister? We need to *show* mercy, tenderness, trust—as God shows them to us. One doesn't have to talk too much about it; one has to pray a lot about it.

I pray constantly, unceasingly, asking God for one thing: that Christians may love one another and spill that love over non-Christians. That's all that I want God to grant us—as I am sure he wants to do. But in order to receive his graces we have to cooperate. He made us free, totally free to accept and reject his graces. His gifts may not be visible to our earthly eyes, but they can be seen by the eyes of our heart. Stretch out your hands and take whatever you wish. They are yours for the taking: his mercy, his gentleness, his forgiveness, all of it. Just stretch out your hands.
