This weekend Church Services TV is involved in a two-day online celebration of the life of Blessed Mother Teresa to coincide with her canonisation in Rome on **Sunday 4th September**.

www.churchservices.tv and catholicireland.net are partners. It provides a daily live streaming facility to many churches in Ireland (including the Augustinians) and has been doing this since 2005.

Church Services TV and Heavens Road FM radio station in the UK will be joining forces in order to stream Masses, choirs, and guests all focusing on the life and legacy of Mother Teresa from over 20 different Catholic cathedrals and parish locations throughout the UK and Ireland.

Broadcasts will be available on any mobile device (and there is no need for an App) as well as the normal PC or laptop. This will be the launch of Heaven's Road Catholic Online Radio's own TV Channel.



Bishops, priests and special guests who met Mother Teresa in their lives will be inviting viewers to share those very special memories.

Catholic and Christian choirs, songwriters and poets will be performing live in different locations and Mass will be celebrated in the morning, afternoon and evening.

Founded in 2014, Heaven's Road Catholic Online Radio has listeners in over 170 countries worldwide and has been showing over 200 live Masses every week primarily for the housebound in partnership with Church Services TV.

Mother Teresa entered her religious life in Ireland at Loreto Abbey Rathfarnham and Rathfarnham parish is involved along with a number of other Irish cathedrals and churches including St Aidan's in Enniscorthy and Sligo Cathedral.

Asked if the venture is the first of its kind, Tony Bolger (Managing Director of Church Service) told catholicireland.net, "We believe this is a first in many ways but certainly we believe it is a first in Catholic church terms that two countries united in one mission would collaborate on-line in such a programme."
