

The text of this month's video message reads: The arts give expression to the beauty of the faith and proclaim the Gospel message of the grandeur of God's creation. When we admire a work of art or a marvel of nature, we discover how everything speaks

to us of Him and of His love.

The Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network of the Apostleship of Prayer developed the "Pope Video" initiative to assist in the worldwide dissemination of monthly intentions of the Holy Father in relation to the challenges facing humanity.

Conference Marking the 5th Centenary of Martin Luther's Reformation

500 years ago this October, the Augustinian Friar, Martin Luther changed the world as it was then known. The publication of his 95 theses was to unleash a torrent of reform that would reach far beyond the spheres of religion and ecclesiastical authority.

This conference will take place on Saturday 7th October in the Tara Building of Mary Immaculate College. It will begin at 9.30am with the opening address given by Fr. Alejandro Moral Antón O.S.A. Prior General of the Augustinian Order. Other guest speakers will include : Pro. Carlos Eire : Luther's Redefinition of the Sacred? Pro. Marian Lyons: Ireland's Magisterial Reformation in the 16th & 17th Centuries.



Dr. Colman O Clabaigh OSB: From Reform to Reformation: The Augustinian Friars in 15th & 16th Centuries.
Dr. Kieran O'Mahony OSA: Sola Scriptura: What did it mean? And what became of it?

Archbishop Michael Jackson: Is the Reformation still to happen?
Bishop Brendan Leahy: From Conflict to Dialogue.
Dr. Jim Puglisi: "I think that Martin Luther's intentions were not mistaken" (Pope Francis) 50 years of dialogue and three Pillars: Church, Ministry, Eucharist.

The first part of the Conference will explore the beginnings of this Reformation, how it impacted on Ireland and on the Augustinian friars. The second part will explore the theological dimensions of the Lutheran Reformation and the current state of agreements between Roman Catholics and Lutherans. The conference will conclude on Sunday 8th with Mass at 11.15am in St. Augustine's church Limerick.
