This time next year we will be in the final stages of preparation for World Meeting of Families in Dublin. Families will have arrived from across the world, tickets will be sold out and the whole country will be wondering what the three day event will be like!

However, we want this to be more than a three day wonder - this is our opportunity to create and develop family ministry in every parish in our diocese! So we want everyone to know about and engage with the one year preparation plan that is being rolled out. The planners have listened well to the hundreds of people consulted across the country and decided on a few key points:

* We begin by supporting and celebrating what already is - this Autumn parishes will be offered resources for existing moments (gifts for parents of the newly baptised, Christmas resources, etc). This will support, include and encourage us.

* In Spring a six week parish program, as well as a variety of school and youth programs will be offered. Many are online as well as in paper copies, so that people can access the reflections in as many ways as possible.

* Pope Francis specifically asked that the preparation focus on a letter he wrote about family, called 'the joy of family'. So the sessions will listen first to 'our experiences' and then to Pope Francis reflections, on six themes.

Over 70,000 events are organised every year in order to help raise awareness of Europe's common heritage and the continuous need for its protection. This year we are celebrating the intrinsic relationship between people and nature under the common theme of Heritage and Nature.
