Augustinian Vocation News

Some of you may not be aware that Drogheda is the house for initial formation for the Irish Augustinians. This means that any man who comes forward to discern his vocation as an Augustinian comes to Drogheda for at least a year. In the three years the House of Formation has been opened we have had three men enter the Augustinians: one each year .

Drogheda was chosen specifically because of the great support and encouragement that the friars experience here. Currently we have two men in formation; Stephen who is an Noviciate, in the U.S. and Gabriel who has recently joined us from Limerick. Below is a short update on our students.

My name is Gabriel Schmidt and I was born on April 5th, 1977 in Velky Kris, a little town in the south of Slovakia . My family on my fathers side is descended from Germany. My father's name is also Gabriel and my mother is Marta. I have only one sister, Marta. I moved to Ireland in 2008 at the age of 31, with my sister and her husband and settled in Limerick. I began working in Bunratty Folk Park in the Banqueting Hall. In 2015 I went to the Holy Land and had a great experience there. In 2016



and 2017 I volunteered as a helper in Lourdes. These experiences helped me greatly in discerning my vocation. I attended Mass regularly in St. Augustine's in Limerick and met many friends there.

At present I am in Drogheda to see if I am called to be an Augustinian. Please keep me in your prayers and do say hello when you see me.

Currently most English speaking students and Novices go to Racine in Wisconsin, USA for Noviciate. The Noviciate is a special year of formation where novices spend a lot of time in prayer and in learning more about the Order its saints, traditions, history, etc. On Wednesday 11th October our second student Stephen together with five other classmates took an important step in their journey to becoming Augustinians; they received their white habits. Along with Stephen was David an novice from England and four from the American Provinces. Please keep them all in your prayers and anyone interested in discussing more about vocations, contact Fr. 

Service of Remembrance

The University Maternity Hospital Limerick will hold its annual remembrance service at the Church of the Holy Rosary, Ennis Road, Limerick, on Sunday, November 5th at 3pm.

We invite parents who have experienced the death of their baby / pregnancy loss at any stage, together with their family, friends and hospital staff to this service.

This service is organised by the Counselling Department and Midwifery staff at UMHL. And people are very welcome to stay after the service for a chat and a cup of tea. We ask that people attending the service show sensitivity to newly bereaved families by using the quiet space available for crying babies/young children.

The service is an annual event which aims to acknowledge the pregnancies that were lost and the lives of babies who have died through ectopic pregnancy, miscarriage, stillbirth and neonatal death. We welcome parents and families together in their grief and acknowledge the short lives of their babies.
