World Day of the Sick

Pope Francis reminds the church of her 'maternal vocation' to the needy and the Sick

Pope Francis is urging Catholics worldwide to bring to the sick and needy "the Lord's own gaze, full of tenderness and compassion," reminding the Church of her "maternal vocation" to them. The exhortation came in his message for World Day of the Sick of the Catholic Church that is traditionally observed on February 11th, the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes.

The message for the 26th World Day of the Sick has as its theme: *Mater Ecclesiae*: "Behold, your son... Behold, your mother. And from that hour the disciple took her into his home" (Jn 19:26-27). Instituted by St. Pope John Paul II on May 13th, 1992, the annual observance intends to draw attention to the sick and their caregivers.

In his message the Pope recalls that "on the Cross, Jesus showed his concern for the Church and all humanity, and Mary is called to share in that same concern." The entire community of disciples, he says, is included in Mary's maternal vocation, and like her, the disciples are called to care for one another, excluding no one, simply because they are persons, children of God.

In the message, Pope Francis evokes the image of the Church as a "field hospital", noting that in some parts of the world Church hospitals are the only institutions providing necessary care to the population. The Holy Father also urges Catholic hospitals to steer clear of "the business mentality that is seeking worldwide to turn health care into a profit-making enterprise, which ends up discarding the poor."

To Mary, Mother of tender love, we wish to entrust all those who are ill in body and soul, that she may sustain them in hope. We ask her also to help us to be welcoming to our sick brothers and sisters. May the Virgin Mary intercede for this Twenty-sixth World Day of the Sick; may she help the sick to experience their suffering in communion with the Lord Jesus; and may she support all those who care for them. Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday could hardly make more tangible the transience of things and our own mortality. We start Lent humbly, close to the ground, close to our earthiness: "Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return." But the ashes are not just to commemorate the transience of creation. These ashes used this Wednesday are the residue of the palms of last year's Passion-Sunday. Jesus died and was buried in a tomb, the place of decay and the place of dust. Yet he rose from the dead to new life. Our ultimate destiny is not dust and ashes but a sharing in the Lord's risen life, becoming conformed to the image of Christ. As we journey towards that destiny we hear the call to grow more fully into the image of God's Son, which is a call to turn away from sin, to repent. *The ashes are a sign of our desire to do just that.*
