## 24 Hours for the Lord

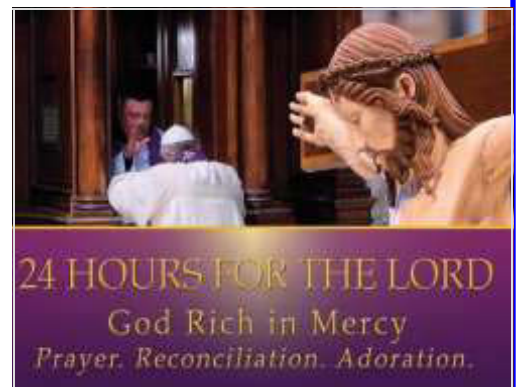
'The Lenten Journey is an opportunity to return to the Lord 'wholeheartedly and in every aspect of our life', Pope Francis has told the faithful in his annual message for Lent.

Urging members of the Church to take up the Lenten journey with enthusiasm, sustained by almsgiving, fasting and prayer, he reminded people to participate in this year's '24 Hours for the Lord' initiative, describing it as a moment of grace which invites the entire Church community to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation in the context of Eucharistic Adoration.

In 2018, the theme of '24 Hours for the Lord' is taken from Psalm 130:4 '**With you is forgiveness**'.

Pope Francis said he hoped his message would help the entire church experience this time of grace anew, with joy and in truth.

St. Augustine's Church Limerick will again host this special event this year and will remain open for 24 consecutive hours, from Friday 9th March following the 4pm Mass and finishing Saturday 10th with the 3pm Mass for the Sick. This will be an opportunity for both Eucharistic Adoration and sacramental confession. The initiative encourages everyone to come to the Sacrament of Reconciliation.



Pope Francis himself will be participating in the initiative and will preside at a penitential service in Saint Peter's Basilica in order to place the Sacrament of Reconciliation at the centre of the Church's mission of the new evangelisation.
