





We celebrate the Feast of St. Rita on Tuesday 22nd May here in the Augustinian Church. An exceptional Saint a young widow who suffered years at the centre of family feuds in medieval Italy. A young woman yearning to become a religious; a nun in Cascia who bore the thorn of the Crucified; a mystic, whose love for Christ has marked her out as exceptional. As the Saint of the Impossible people pray to her for their many intentions and also for those doing exams. The Triduum begins on Saturday 19th May—finishing Tuesday 22nd with St. Rita Feast Day and the blessing of the Roses. Novena prayers will be recited on Saturday, Monday and Tuesday at the 10.15am & 4.00pm Masses.
