'God is asking of us -to be holy'

In a pastoral letter to be read at Masses this weekend, Bishop Brendan Leahy of Limerick has suggested to Catholics in his diocese to "take holiness as a theme for Lent this year".

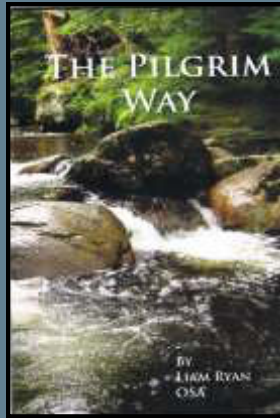
I do so because Pope Francis has recently written a wonderful letter on holiness reminding us of its importance, he writes on the diocesan website. —"At a time when we are getting used to pastoral units and new pastoral arrangements in our Diocese, it is good to keep our eye on what ultimately matters – our holiness." Speaking on Ash Wednesday, the Bishop of Limerick admitted that there was a fall-off in the number of people actively engaged in the Church. As a result, "Lent does not have the same impact in terms of people giving things up, which was the traditional response to Lent.

—"But while it may not be a time for giving things up for people it could be a time for giving more. By way of that, I mean giving more of themselves to others. Doing good deeds."

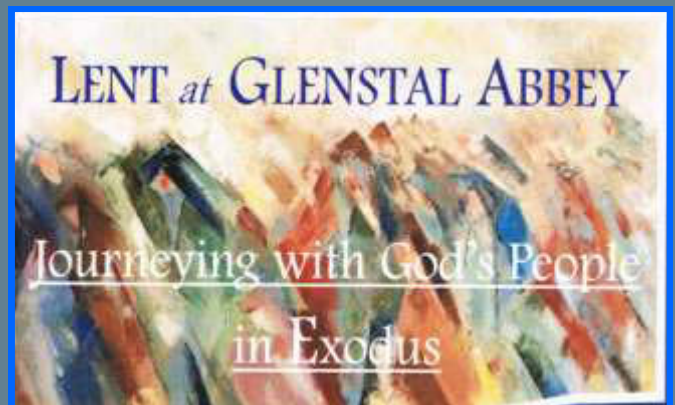
Lent at Glenstal Abbey
