The Northstar Annual Service of Commemoration and Hope will take place in this church next Thursday October 10th at 7.00pm.

This is a community based project providing non-judgemental, confidential support to families who are affected by, and trying to cope with, a family member's substance misuse. They do this work by providing one on one support, access to counselling, training opportunities and vitally, through peer support and simply providing time and space for families to speak freely without judgement.

The service is an opportunity to remember loved ones who were lost through drugs and alcohol misuse and to offer support to families left behind. During the Service people will be invited to write a message of remembrance which will then be placed on a large candle at the altar. Everyone is welcome.
