Remembering Our Loved Ones

The journey through grief is unique to each person. Each member of a family feels the pain of loss in his or her own way. Human anguish cannot be programmed. Support groups may be helpful in some cases. They provide spaces and places where the bereaved can share feelings in a safe confidential setting with others who have been through a similar experience.

Services of Remembrance bring a faith dimension to the loss of a loved one. There is a place for questions, for doubt, for anger, for tears, for wrestling with God in these services. Strength and consolation can come from the lighting of a candle, a name on the November Dead list or a bunch of flowers on a grave.


Congratulations Fr. Noel Hession osa Celebrates Silver Jubilee


Service of Remembrance



We invite parents who have experienced the death of their baby / pregnancy loss at any stage, together with their family, friends and hospital staff to this service.




This service is organised by the Counselling Department and Midwifery staff at UMHL. And people are very welcome to stay after the service for a chat and a cup of tea. We ask that people attending the service show sensitivity to newly bereaved families by using the quiet space available for crying babies/young children.

The service is an annual event which aims to acknowledge the pregnancies that were lost and the lives of babies who have died through ectopic pregnancy, miscarriage, still-birth and neonatal death. We welcome parents and families together in their grief and acknowledge the short lives of their babies.
