# Augustinian Lay Forum

We make the path by walking it

Last Tuesday we had another great turn out for our third Augustinian Lay Forum gathering in the Pery Hotel. Our journey involved meeting up to discern our next steps as we plan for our Augustinian Synod next March 2020. Our journey together is praying, singing, listening, talking, agreeing, disagreeing, group discussions, sharing thoughts, ideas, structures and vision.

Fr. John Hennebry OSA (Augustinian Provincial) opened the evening by saying "that as we move toward a Synodical Church, how is God calling us to be in an Augustinian context". The evening was facilitated by our usual facilitator Jim Deeds. The discussion centered around these three points

- 1. What is the purpose of the Synod?
- 2. What would make for a good Synod?
- 3. How can we hear from other groups and dissenting voices?

As we listened to each other we were very much aware how positive, real and challenging our responses were! It is already clear, that the people at all our gatherings want the Synod to be a gathering of joy and hope where real issues are faced and good decisions taken and worked through.



This follows the model of church that Pope Francis speaks about and which he believes is God's will for the church.
