# Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

The Kingdom values of the Beatitudes and the life of Jesus introduced a different kind of Kingship to the world. He came to serve and not to be served, to wash

feet, to be a friend of sinners, to associate with the untouchables, to be crucified between two thieves. He challenged those who lorded it over people. In the Gospel for today's Mass Jesus distanced himself from the power model of Kingship before Pilate. His apostles and followers were confused about his role right to the end. They expected a powerful political liberator, not a suffering servant inviting them to embrace a cross of suffering and humiliation as he



did. This is a tremendous feast with which to end the liturgical year because it

turns upside down all the pre conceived ideas we have about hierarchy, Kingship and what it means to be in authority".



Almighty and eternal God, to Jesus Christ, first-born from the dead, you have granted everlasting dominion and a kingship that shall not pass away. Remove from us every desire for privilege and power, that we may imitate the sacrificial love of Christ our King, and, as a royal and priestly people, serve you humbly in our brothers and sisters. Through Christ, our Lord. Amen

## Thank You


A big thank you to all who supported our Team Hope Christmas Shoebox Appeal this year. 68 beautifully wrapped boxes were


