## John Paul II Awards

Speaking as he presented 50 John Paul II Awards to young people from across the Limerick diocese, Bishop Brendan Leahy said that the young people stepped up during the Covid-19 pandemic to support others and this was particularly **encouraging**. Bishop Leahy said, **"I was delighted to be able to present these John Paul II Awards to such inspirational young people.** The work they have been doing in their local areas is tremendous and brings such richness to their parishes, their local communities and to themselves. For many there is a realisation that young people have a significant role to play in the Church, this gives me great hope for **the future."**

The John Paul II medals were presented by Bishop Leahy at an award ceremony in Scoil Pól in Kilfinane, the first one since the outbreak of Covid-19. The award programme, which is sponsored by the Knights of Saint Columbanus, is coordinated by the pastoral outreach team in the Limerick Diocesan Centre.

## Pray for Peace

Pope Francis has again appealed for peace, entrusting his prayers to Our Lady. **"Spiritually kneeling before the Virgin, I entrust to her the ardent desire for peace of so many people, who in various parts of the world, suffer the senseless disaster of war,"** he said.

The Pope addressed his remarks to men and women of goodwill after the Regina Coeli prayer in Saint Peter's Square at noon.


Noting that at this very hour, many faithful gather around the venerated image of Mary in the Shrine of Pompeii, to address to her the Supplication that flowed from the heart of the Blessed Bartolo Longo, he said he too kneels before the Virgin in supplication for the gift of peace.

**"To the Blessed Virgin,"** the Pope said, **"I present in particular the sufferings and tears of the Ukrainian people."**

**"In the face of the madness of war, let us continue, please, to pray the Rosary for peace every day."**

And, he continued asking for prayers for the leaders of nations: **"That they may not lose their 'feel' for their people who want peace, and know well that weapons will never bring it."**


## Thought for the Day
