
## The Baptism of the Lord

A beautiful painting by the Italian 15<sup>th</sup> century artist Piero della Francesca is the Baptism of Christ. It is a marvel of harmony, balance and composition. Many of the great medieval artists were theologians in art – della Francesca, in his Baptism painting, is exploring the central mystery of Christian faith – the total fusion of the human and divine. The painting is a theological triumph. It has caught, in art expression, the moment the Holy Spirit bursts through the humanity of Jesus in visible form. John is baptising Jesus in the river Jordan and there is an incredible shimmering, translucent whiteness enveloping the body of Jesus; the same whiteness catches other figures in the painting and nearby tree. Directly above Jesus we see the Dove descending and we can almost hear the voice of the Father: "This is my Beloved Son in whom I am well pleased".

The mystery of Bethlehem, the Infant who somehow is God, at last begins to show itself. The very first effect of the Baptism in Jesus is that the Spirit drives Jesus into the desert – where He spends 40 days; 40 days in which Jesus takes upon Himself His Divinity - He owns his divinity, reflects on it, becomes more and more at one with the Father in his human nature. The process is all-consuming, takes a long time (40 days) in which he barely eats and when the process is completed he is exhausted in his humanity and ideal subject for the temptations that now encompass him.

At the core of the Baptism of Jesus is activity of Divine Spirit. John the Baptist had declared to questioners that he was not the Christ: his baptism was of water but Christ's baptism would be of water and the Spirit –of a different order altogether.

The wonder: each of us has within us those same divine stirrings that lay hidden in Jesus for 30 years : the Spirit. There is a human restlessness within us. The greatest calamity of our times is the smothering, blocking out, total ignorance of the divine within us. Surely after Christmas festivities we can readily acknowledge that all the earthly substitutes and enticements dangled persistently in front of us cannot ever satisfy our much greater human longings for satisfaction of our inner personalities, our minds, our souls, our hearts. We are afraid to believe that more is possible. The 19th century French writer Anais Nin wrote: " And the day came when the risk it took to remain tight inside the bud was more painful than the risk it took to blossom". May our day dawn for us.
